HISTORY OF NJSIAA BOYS SOCCER

The following references to soccer were found in the NJSIAA Executive Committee Minutes. Many of the minutes from the “early years (1922-1932)” were handwritten and very difficult to read. We thought these references would interest soccer fans.

From the October 6, 1922 minutes: Soccer was added to “the list of recognized sports of the Association.”

From December 12, 1923 minutes: “Communication was received from Mr. Patrick, Secretary of the State Football Association relative to running a Cup-tie Championship in Soccer. On motion of Mr. Sieber, seconded by Mr. Todd, and passed that the Secretary be made a committee of one with power to act to arrange for a Cup-tie Championship, provided a sufficient number of schools are interested to take part.

The Spalding trophy, donated by A. G. Spalding Brothers, to be competed for by the high schools was presented to the Association. On motion of Mr. Moller, seconded by Mr. Holbert and passed the Association accepted this trophy to award it to the high school which is the winner of the Class A Championship. The trophy to be competed for annually and to become the permanent property of the school winning it three times. Motion by Mr. Lillis, seconded by Mr. Sieber and passed, that the school holding the trophy must be bonded for \$200.00 for the return of the trophy at the end of its year of possession.”

From February 1, 1924 minutes: “The Committee on Soccer reported that three schools, Harrison, Ridgewood and Trenton, replied favorably to the invitation to take part in a Cup-tie Championship. Harrison was drawn to oppose Ridgewood in the first round. The winner of this game to play Trenton as a final round.”

From October 25, 1926 minutes: “The question of soccer championship was brought to the attention of the Committee, and it was voted to award sectional championships based on records of teams consistent with type of schedule and calibre [sic] of opponents.”

From October 7, 1927 minutes: “Soccer – Paterson declared Central Section Champion. No other championships awarded.”

From January 30, 1928 minutes: “Soccer. Eight teams submitted records for consideration. Central High School of Paterson and Harrison High School were declared tie for the State Championship of 1927-28.”

From December 3, 1928 minutes: “Soccer: A communication was presented from Mr. Livingstone of Eastside High School, Paterson, regarding the possibility of a soccer tournament. After some discussion it was felt that it would be impractical to attempt a soccer tournament this year; first, because of the expense that might be involved in conducting such a tournament; second, the time likely to be required in order to go through an elimination series. The Secretary was authorized to collect soccer records for 1928, which the Executive Committee would study. If it be deemed advisable, the Committee may award a championship on season’s record.”

From February 15, 1929 minutes: “The Soccer Championship was considered. The records of the various teams were duly considered. Kearny’s record was considered best for the year. Motion was made, seconded and passed that Kearny would be awarded the Soccer Championships for 1929.”

From the March 27, 1930 minutes: “The soccer records submitted by Kearny, Harrison, Dickinson, Trenton, E. Rutherford, E. Orange, Verona, Seton Hall and Barringer were studied closely. Motion was made by Mr. Henckel, seconded by Mr. Rhodes, and passed, that Kearny High School be awarded Soccer Championship for 1929-30.”

From the October 16, 1930 minutes: “Championships, both state and district, awarded by the Executive Committee of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association, are based on something more than number of games won and lost. Standards of sportsmanship, fair play, keeping faith with competitors, are always taken into consideration. Any team or individual to be considered for championship honors must have high standards in all these factors.”

From the March 13, 1932 minutes: “Harrison awarded championships in soccer.” *(We think this is for the 1931 season because of the next reference below.)*

From the December 12, 1932 minutes: “Soccer records were received from 10 schools. Those records were carefully studied and Trenton High School was awarded the championship for 1932. Trenton had a record of 9 games – no defeats and 3 ties.”
