

## 2011 NJSIAA/INVESTORS SAVINGS BANK GIRLS LACROSSE TOURNAMENT

### (COACHES MUST HAVE A COPY OF THESE INSTRUCTIONS AVAILABLE AT EACH GAME)

#### TO QUALIFY

1. Teams having played a minimum of ten (10) games and having at least a fifty percent (50%) winning record regardless of the strength of schedule. Schools submitting schedules with less than 10 games, must add losses to reach the minimum number of ten, to qualify.
2. Teams will be placed on the brackets in accordance with their Lax Power ranking and filled to sixteen teams. If more than sixteen teams request entry into a bracket, those with records below .500% will be determined by the Committee, based on percentage.
3. Seventy percent (70%) of games played on or before the cutoff date (May 9<sup>th</sup>) must be against New Jersey Schools
4. Any player with two (2) or more disqualifications in the current season, prior to the start of the NJSIAA Tournament, will be unable to compete in said tournament.
5. Any varsity team accumulating three (3) or more player or coach disqualifications for flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct prior to the start of the NJSIAA tournament will not be permitted to participate in same. Seeded teams will forfeit their right to compete if a disqualification limit is reached prior to the start of the tournament for the team.

6. All schedules and results must be entered on [Lax@laxpower.com](mailto:Lax@laxpower.com) AND [www.njschoolsports.com](http://www.njschoolsports.com) following each game. Laxpower rankings will be used in the seeding process, but records from both sources will be compared. Please check to see that all games and scores have been entered on both [www.njschoolsports.com](http://www.njschoolsports.com) and [Lax@laxpower.com](mailto:Lax@laxpower.com) before May 10<sup>th</sup>. If you do not know your school code, or you encounter problems, please contact [support@njschoolsports.com](mailto:support@njschoolsports.com) or the NJSIAA. Original Ranking from May 9<sup>th</sup> will be used to seed the Tournament of Champions.

To promote fairness in competition and the health and safety of student athletes, no NJSIAA member school will be eligible to participate in any NJSIAA Championship Tournament if it has violated the Specific Sports Regulations for the sport including, but not limited to, the start of practice, the start and ending of the sport season and the maximum contests permitted during the regular season. The application of this eligibility standard is non-appealable.

**SPECIFIC SPORTS REGULATIONS** (found in the *New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association Handbook 2009-2010 Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules & Regulations*)

#### RULE 12. Lacrosse

Section 1. Rules The United States Women's Lacrosse Association Rules shall govern all NJSIAA games.

Section 2. Start of Practice. – First Friday in March.

Section 3. Start of Regular Season. April 1, 2011

Section 4. End of Season (From Rule 2, Section 10)

All teams may participate in interscholastic contests up to the final championship in their respective sports. Exceptions: Winter Track – Feb 28 (Golf will be up to and including the Friday before the NJSIAA championships in softball and baseball.) Individual competition shall terminate with the end of said competition.

Section 5. Scrimmages. Interschool scrimmages are to be limited to three (3) per week until the first starting date; thereafter, including the week of the first starting date, scrimmages will be subject to the provisions of Rule 12, Section 6.

CL 1 Scrimmages during the regular season count toward the allowable number of games.

Section 6. Games Per Week. Not more than a total of three (3) lacrosse games may be played per week beginning with the week of the start of the regular schedule (this includes interschool scrimmages, regular games, postponed games, and tournament games, but games may not be played on three (3) consecutive days. This section does not apply to state Tournament scheduling. You may play one four game week.

Section 7. Maximum Games. A member school may play eighteen (18) games, plus one tournament, plus the State Tournament, or twenty (20) games plus the State Tournament.

Throughout the entire season, scores must be reported following each game, to [www.njschoolsports.com](http://www.njschoolsports.com) and [Lax@laxpower.com](mailto:Lax@laxpower.com). If you do not know your school code, or encounter problems, please contact [support@njschoolsports.com](mailto:support@njschoolsports.com) or the NJSIAA. The Seeding Committee will use these results to determine that all games have been entered, and for advancing the brackets.

**Please note** - A student athlete who transfers after May 1, 2011 regardless of whether the transfer was the result of a bona fide change of residence, shall be ineligible to participate in any post season championship competition at the new school.

TEAMS

Public and Non-Public teams will compete in common brackets. Teams will be divided into four (4) equal groups based on enrollment. Each group will then be divided into North and South Sections according to geographic location using northing numbers. These divisions will be developed when entries are received.

ENTRY FEE

Eighty dollars (\$80.00). Make checks payable to NJSIAA and forward with entry form to the Tournament Director. Please be sure the school's name appears on the check. **VOUCHERS MUST INCLUDE A SELF-ADDRESSED, STAMPED ENVELOPE.**

ENTRY DEADLINE

Records must be recorded for all games played up to and including Monday, May 9, 2011 on [www.njschoolsports.com](http://www.njschoolsports.com) and [Lax@laxpower.com](mailto:Lax@laxpower.com). **Records will be downloaded on May 10<sup>th</sup> at noon.**

**The Tournament will be seeded on May 11, 2011. Divisions will be established using the Intent Forms. After comparison with records on www.njschoolsports.com, Lax Power will be used to seed teams, once divisions are established. Brackets will be posted on njschoolsports.com in the evening on May 11, 2011/Final May 12<sup>th</sup>.**

IN ACCORDANCE WITH NJSIAA BY-LAWS, SCHOOLS FAILING TO FOLLOW DIRECTIONS FOR ENTERING THE TOURNAMENT IN A TIMELY FASHION WILL BE SUBJECT TO A FINE. THAT TEAM WILL BE SEEDED ACCORDING TO THEIR RECORD, HOWEVER THEY WILL FORFEIT THE ABILITY TO HOST A GAME EVEN IF THEY ARE THE HIGHER SEEDED TEAM.

DATES

Tournament dates are May 16 to June 4, 2011.

Seeding will be determined on Wednesday, May 11, 2011. **Fax the Intent Form by May 9<sup>th</sup>**

Preliminaries - Games may be played earlier than dates indicated on pairings form, if both schools agree; however, in cases of disagreement, the game must be played as follows and non-NJSIAA tournament games scheduled for these dates must be rescheduled.

Schools entering the tournament WILL NOT be granted a change of date due to any conflicts with school trips, proms, banquets, SAT's, and the like.

Seeding for the T of C will be based on the original Lax Power rankings from May 10<sup>th</sup>. #1 seed will play # 4, # 2 will Play # 3.

**Winning teams must call Cindy Beradino (973) 331-7100 x 2801 (School) or (201) 317-3414 (cell) following Sectional Group Semifinals.**

SITES

Sites for all games up to and including the Sectional Finals, will be the home field of the higher seeded team as determined by the Seeding Committee.

Sites will not be declared unsuitable merely because field conditions are less than perfect unless Leagues or Conferences have ruled such sites unsuitable for League or Conference play.

POSTPONEMENT

Responsibility for postponing a game shall rest with the person in charge of the playing site, and it shall be his/her responsibility to notify both schools and the Tournament Director at least three (3) hours prior to game time if a postponement is necessary. The Tournament Director will be responsible for postponement of final game.

OFFICIALS

It is **mandatory** that the two competing schools agree on the selection of officials for all preliminary games. It is recommended during the preliminaries that the same official is not used by a team, more than once.

- a. **Preliminaries: after consultation, each school shall request one official from their assignor. The home will compensate both officials, and must provide and compensate an adult scorer/timer.**
- b. **For Sectional Finals, the State Assignor will assign three officials and a table umpire. The home team will compensate the table umpire and the three officials.**
- c. Three officials and one timer for the Group Finals and the T of C Semifinal games will be assigned by the Tournament Director, and compensated by NJSIAA.
- d. Officials will be assigned to the Tournament of Champions Final game by the Tournament Director. The NJSIAA will pay for all officials in the State Finals.

The recommended fees per official are:

RULES

The 2010/2011 US Lacrosse / NFHS Rules, with NJSIAA modifications will govern all tournament games.

LACROSSE BALLS

Each school must provide three (3) new yellow lacrosse balls that have been approved by the NFHS for each game, including semifinals. Balls will be provided for the Tournament of Champions Finals.

GAME

1. All teams selected will be assigned to brackets by the Seeding Committee and must be prepared to play the first round games. Games will begin on Monday, May 16<sup>th</sup> or Tuesday, May 17<sup>th</sup> depending upon the group.
2. All preliminary games shall start no later than 4:00 p.m. unless both schools agree to a different time.
3. Teams shall arrive at least thirty (30) minutes before game time.
4. The home team must provide an **adult** scorer/timer for all preliminary games. A table umpire will be assigned on the clock for Sectional Finals, Group Finals and Tournament of Champions games.
5. A coin toss will determine choice of goal.
6. The higher seeded team will wear the light color jersey unless otherwise agreed upon by the competing schools.

**Rule Modifications:**

**The following will be inserted into both the Tournament Regulations and the Rule Modifications for Tournament play only:**

**New 2011**

**When weather or other circumstances prevent the completion of a game, the following modifications shall be in place:**

- a. **If 80% or more of the game has been played and the score is NOT tied, and the game cannot be resumed within an hour of leaving the field, the score at the time of interruption shall stand.**
- b. **If 80% or more of the game has been played and the score is tied, and the game cannot be resumed within one hour of leaving the field, the game will resume the following day from the point of interruption.**
- c. **If a tournament game is interrupted or suspended because of events beyond the control of the responsible authorities, it shall be continued from the point of interruption. By mutual agreement of the opposing coaches and the approval of the referee, any period may be shortened or the game terminated.**

***NOTE: the above modifications will not apply to the T of C Final***

TIE-BREAKER

**In order to insure accurate Lax Power rankings for all teams, ties must be broken during the regular season using the procedure outlined in the Girls Lacrosse Rule Modifications.**

The Tie-Breaker Procedure will be as provided for in the 2011 US Lacrosse/NFHS Women's Rules and will be used for all regular season and Tournament games, up to but not including the T of C Final.

In the TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS FINAL ONLY the following procedure will be followed:

1. When the score is tied at the end of regular playing time, both teams will have a five (5) minute rest and toss a coin for choice of ends. up
2. Six minutes (two 3 minute periods) of stop-clock overtime will be played. The clock will be stopped after 3 minutes of play in order for teams to change ends with no delay for coaching. The game will be restarted by a center draw. The team which is ahead at the end of six minutes wins the game.
3. If teams are still tied after six minutes have elapsed, the teams will have a 3 minute rest and change ends.
4. The winner will then be decided on a "sudden victory" stop-clock overtime of no more than six minutes in length with the teams changing ends after 3 minutes. The game will be restarted by a center draw. The team scoring the first goal wins the game.

TIE-BREAKER (Continued)

IF A TIE STILL EXISTS AFTER THE TWO (2) SIX (6)-MINUTE OVERTIME PERIODS, A CO-CHAMPIONSHIP WILL BE DECLARED.

TRANSPORTATION/SUPERVISION

1. Schools will pay all transportation expenses for all games.
2. **PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS MUST ASSIGN AN ADMINISTRATOR OR DESIGNEE WHO WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUPERVISING ALL GAMES. IF IT IS FELT NECESSARY TO PROVIDE POLICE PROTECTION, OFFICERS SHALL BE SECURED FROM THE AREA IN WHICH THE GAME IS PLAYED, AND THE COST SHALL BE SHARED BY THE SCHOOLS.**
3. The NJSIAA will provide additional policing for the Tournament of Champions Final.

DISQUALIFICATION

Participation by an ineligible player in any game during the regular season results in forfeiture of said game. If such forfeit(s) would have caused the school's failure to qualify for the tournament or if an ineligible player participates in a tournament game, said school will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place. Schools eliminated prior to the last opponent will not re-enter tournament competition.

SIGNS

In accordance with NJSIAA Policy, banners/signs **will not** be permitted at game sites including the **Final site.** **Face paint will not be permitted to be worn by players.**

PROTESTS

Protests based upon an official's judgment, or misinterpretation, or misapplication of the playing rules will not be honored as per NJSIAA Bylaws, Article VII, Section 1.

ATHLETIC EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

Each school participating in the tournament will provide for the care and treatment of their athletes within the school's policy as in effect during the regular season. When games are scheduled at predetermined sites, schools should not assume that the home school trainer will be available, and should therefore, prepare for the care of their athletes. The athletic emergency procedure of the host school will be in effect during the tournament which should include the establishment of a line of communication for emergent situations. The NJSIAA may assign athletic trainers for state final events to assist with emergency situations.

Some sources of assistance that may be utilized when physicians are not available are certified athletic trainers, emergency medical technicians usually on emergency vehicles, ambulance vehicle with trained personnel, rescue vehicle with trained first-aid personnel and, in some areas, National Guard or Army Reserve Medical personnel assigned to ambulance duty. Schools may also have other school personnel qualified in first-aid, who may be available for duty during activities.

- a. Recommended procedures that may be followed in successful emergency care are:
  1. Immediate, on the spot first-aid by an individual with adequate training.
  2. Communication System. An available, non-pay telephone with an outside line to contact a physician or ambulance service. Arrangements should be made in advance to insure availability.
  3. Emergency care facility. Arrangements should be made, in advance, with staff personnel of local hospital or clinic to notify, in case of emergency, that emergency service is necessary.
  4. Notification. The facility to which the injured player is being transported should be immediately informed of the injured player's status. Necessary personnel and equipment should be available in the facility or physicians, on call, could be notified of the emergency.
  5. Transportation. Ambulance, emergency vehicle, first-aid vehicle or rescue vehicle, with appropriate equipment and personnel may be parked at the field or game site. If this procedure is not feasible, prior arrangements should be made to have equipment on call when an emergency develops. Again, an available, non-pay telephone with an outside line should be immediately available.
  6. Communities without physicians, medical clinics, or hospital service should complete arrangements with medical personnel and hospital facilities in the nearest community where such services are available. ATHLETIC EMERGENCY PROCEDURE (Continued)
- b. The plan of action specified above should be carefully covered, in advance, with responsibilities of all concerned – trainer, coach, vehicle personnel, school administrators, local police, deputies, or constables – defined. When an emergency does occur, everyone involved can function as an informed, effective team.
- c. Local plans of action to meet emergency situations will vary depending on availability of medical personnel and facilities, the location of the playing field or site and communications. In all cases, the emergency situation plan is best developed through cooperative action of local school personnel, participating professional medical staff and allied groups.

**ATTENTION:** Principals, Athletic Directors, All Coaches and Officials

**RE: Recommended Precautions Against The Transmission of Blood-Borne Pathogens**

All member schools must provide all coaches with the contents of the NJSIAA Infectious Disease Policy.

The Infectious Disease Policy provides that:

If an individual gets someone else's blood on his/her skin, protective gloves should be worn to wipe the blood off with a disposable towel using soap and water.

Note: If any blood gets on an opponent's uniform during competition or a teammate's uniform during practice, it is not necessary to clean the uniform at that point unless the opponent or teammate has an open cut or unskinned area, or the blood is on a part of the uniform which might come in contact with mucous membranes. If the student-athlete does have an open cut or unskinned area or believes the blood might come in contact with mucous membranes, then the uniform should be wiped with soap and water.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

Players and coaches involved with alcoholic beverages and/or illegal substances before, during or after the game, at the game site or on school property, including chartered busses, shall be suspended from NJSIAA tournament play for one year and be denied any championship rights.

This action was taken in support of the fact that such actions concerning alcoholic beverages and illegal substances are in violation of New Jersey State statutes and will be strictly enforced.

SALES/SOLICITATIONS

Only NJSIAA promotional items will be sold at NJSIAA sponsored events. For the 2010/2011 seasons, **TEAM IP** is the designated vendor.

Solicitations, sale of publications/products or similar activities are NOT permitted without prior authorization from the NJSIAA.

The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association is the sponsoring association for all levels of State Tournaments/Championships. The NJSIAA reserves all rights in regard to the management of these Tournaments/Championships and sale or distribution of any items and any audio-visual reproductions. Any sale or distribution of clothing, souvenirs or any other items is strictly prohibited.

Note: SCHOOLS NOT WILLING OR ABLE TO COMPLY WITH TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS SHOULD NOT ENTER THE TOURNAMENT.

Any member school and/or student-athlete withdrawing from competition after having officially entered an NJSIAA tournament in any sport will be disqualified from all remaining NJSIAA tournament competition in that sport in that season and barred from participating in NJSIAA tournament competition in that sport during the next school year unless truly extraordinary circumstances were present. (Rule 2, Section 17: New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules and Regulations)

ALL TICKETS WILL BE SOLD AT THE GATE. SCHOOLS MUST INFORM THEIR STUDENTS AND LOCAL NEWS MEDIA OF THE ADMISSION POLICY.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPERVISORY PERSONNEL OF COMPETING SCHOOLS AND SECTIONAL REPRESENTATIVES WILL BE ADMITTED BY IDENTIFYING THEMSELVES TO THE GATE PERSONNEL.

## BROADCAST REGULATIONS

- A. The NJSIAA has granted to *The Star-Ledger* and NJ.com the exclusive rights to create, distribute and license programming in connection with NJSIAA tournaments (and NJSIAA sporting events, to the extent the NJSIAA controls or otherwise has authority to grant such rights with regard to NJSIAA sporting events) in all media currently existing or yet to be developed. The Star-Ledger and NJ.com shall have the right to enter into license arrangements with such third parties.
- C. The Star-Ledger and NJ.com may create NJSIAA programming for distribution over media outlets owned or controlled by Advance Publications.
- D. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, including but not limited to Sections A and B above, NJSIAA member schools may broadcast regular season (but not playoff, post-season tournament, or championship) athletic contests involving such schools' own teams or athletes, without charging any fee to any viewer or other third party, on such schools' own commercial-free television networks, their own commercial-free websites, or on commercial-free public access television channels (provided that any agreement between an NJSIAA member school and a commercial-free public access television channel does not permit sublicense or other use of the telecast).
