

## **2011 NJSIAA/RIEGEL GIRLS VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT**

**(COACHES MUST HAVE A COPY OF THESE INSTRUCTIONS AVAILABLE AT EACH MATCH)**

### To Qualify

Teams must be competing on a varsity interscholastic basis and may have:

1. At least **50% WINNING RECORD**, regardless of the strength of their schedule in all matches up to and including Wednesday, October 19, 2011. Whenever ties are broken, the win or loss must be included on the entry form. For #2 below, teams must have:
2. Seventy percent (70%) of matches played before the cutoff date October 19th must be against New Jersey schools.

### **3. NEW PROCEDURE FOR ENTRY**

All varsity schedules **MUST** be entered by the start of the season, and scores reported to [www.njschoolsports.com](http://www.njschoolsports.com) as soon as possible after each contest.

This year, entry forms will not be used; the team schedule will be downloaded prior to the seeding of the tournament and **ONLY** this record will be used for seeding. Coaches are reminded to check this record throughout the season and particularly on Wednesday, October 19th to insure that it is accurate. If you do not know your school code, or you encounter problems, please contact [support@njschoolsports.com](mailto:support@njschoolsports.com) or the NJSIAA.

The Refusal Form included in this document may be faxed to NJSIAA (609) 259-3047 at any time during the season, but must be received no later than Wednesday, October 19, 2011.

4. Any player with two (2) or more disqualifications in the current season, prior to the start of the NJSIAA tournaments, will be unable to compete in said tournament.
5. Any varsity team accumulating three (3) or more player or coach disqualifications for flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct prior to the start of the NJSIAA tournament will not be permitted to participate in same. Seeded teams will forfeit their right to compete if a disqualification limit is reached prior to the start of the tournament for the team.

**To promote fairness in competition and the health and safety of student athletes, no NJSIAA member school will be eligible to participate in any NJSIAA Championship Tournament if it has violated the Specific Sports Regulations for the sport including, but not limited to, the start of practice, the start and ending of the sport season and the maximum contests permitted during the regular season. The application of this eligibility standard is non-appealable.**

Schools submitting schedules with less than twelve (12) matches, must add losses to reach the minimum number (12). All out-of-state matches count on won/loss record.

**SPECIFIC SPORTS REGULATIONS** (found in the *New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association Handbook 2011-2012 Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules & Regulations*)

### **RULE 22. VOLLEYBALL (FALL)**

Section 1. Rules The National Federation Volleyball Rules shall govern all NJSIAA games.

Section 2. Start of Practice. - **20 days before the team's first scheduled game.**

Section 3. Start of Regular Season. Thursday before the second Saturday of September.

Section 4. End of Season (From Rule 2, Section 10)

All teams may participate in interscholastic contests up to the final championship (**Girls Volleyball: T of C**) in their respective sports. Exceptions: Winter Track – Feb 29 (Golf will be up to and including the Friday before the NJSIAA championships in softball and baseball.) Individual competition shall terminate with the end of said competition.

**TEAMS:** Public and Non-Public teams will compete in separate brackets.

REGARDLESS OF REASON, MATCHES NOT COMPLETED BY WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 19, WILL NOT COUNT. DO NOT SEND RECORDS IN ADVANCE OF CUT OFF DATE.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NJSIAA HAS RULED THAT MEMBER SCHOOLS FAILING TO FORWARD TOURNAMENT FORMS TO THE PROPER ADDRESS WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM TOURNAMENT COMPETITION IN THAT SPORT.

DATES

Tournament dates are November 1, 2011 to November 20, 2011.

Seeding will determine deadlines for tournament progression, and dates will be noted on the pairings form which will be forwarded to each school as soon as the Volleyball Committee has completed the pairings.

If a school must play a preliminary match before November 1, a Seeding Committee Member will call the higher seeded school on Wednesday, October 26; others will be notified by internet: [www.njsiaa.org](http://www.njsiaa.org)

Preliminaries - Matches may be played earlier than dates indicated on pairings form if both schools agree; however, in cases of disagreement, the match must be played as follows and non-NJSIAA tournament matches scheduled for these dates must be rescheduled.

SCHOOLS ENTERING THE TOURNAMENT WILL NOT BE GRANTED A CHANGE OF DATE DUE TO ANY CONFLICTS WITH SCHOOL TRIPS, DANCES, BANQUETS, TESTING PROGRAMS, PROMS, GRADUATION, AND THE LIKE.

**SEEDING BY THE VOLLEYBALL COMMITTEE WILL BE BASED ON PERFORMANCES DURING THE GROUP CHAMPIONSHIPS.**

**SITES**

Sites for all PRELIMINARY MATCHES (prior to the NP Semifinals and Public Sectional Finals) will be the home court of the higher seeded team as determined by the Pairings Committee. When conditions prevent a match from being played at the site of the higher seeded team, the Tournament Director may choose an alternate site in cooperation with the competing schools. In the Preliminaries, if a neutral site is preferred by the higher seeded team, that site shall be mutually agreed upon by their opponent; or, in case of disagreement, the Tournament Director shall make the final decision.

Sites will not be declared unsuitable merely because court conditions are less than perfect unless Leagues or Conferences or home management have ruled such sites unsuitable for regular season play.

The NP Semi-finals and Public Sectional Finals will be played at a predetermined site. Finals and Tournament of Champions will be played at a predetermined designated site (Recreation Center - William Paterson University, Wayne, NJ).

Up to, but not including, the NP Semifinals and Public Sectional Finals, whenever a match is played at a pre-determined site for which there are custodial or rental charges, the schools shall share the cost of same.

Responsibility for postponing a match shall rest with the person in charge of the playing site, and it shall be his/her responsibility to notify both schools and the Tournament Director at least three (3) hours prior to match time. The competing school's representatives shall share responsibility for assuring that adequate on-site preparations have been made.

**NJSIAA/RIEGEL PRINTING GIRLS VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT  
SEEDING CRITERIA**

Seeding for the Girls State Volleyball Tournament will be based on evaluating each team by **all the following criteria:**

- Rating Percentage Index (see explanation)
- Head-to-Head Results
- Common Opponent Results
- Win-Loss Record
- Division and/or League Record
- Strength of Schedule
- Committee Vote
- If tied committee vote, then flip coin

Rating Percentage Index (RPI) assigns each team a value based on their strength of schedule. RPI is calculated by totaling the Power Rating Points for each win on a team's record form, and dividing by the total number of wins.

**Power Rating Points**

Each win on a team's record form is assigned a Power Rating value using the following formula:

1. Each team qualifying for the State Tournament is sorted by Winning Percentage, from highest to lowest. The top 20% of this list is assigned a Power rating of 20. The remainder of teams are assigned values as follows:
 

Top	20%	20 pts.
Next	30%	14 pts.
Next	30%	8 pts.
Next	20%	2 pts.
2. Any out-of-state school on a team's record form will not be included in the RPI.

**OFFICIALS**

Two (2) NJSIAA registered volleyball officials shall officiate each match. Each school shall assign ONE (1) official for each Preliminary match and Quarterfinal.

The official assigned by the home team will be the first referee and the visiting team official will be designated as the second referee.

When the home court of one of the schools is used, the school on whose court the match is played shall pay both officials and the visiting school shall pay their own transportation costs.

Schools must not assign the same official to more than one (1) State Tournament match. Schools hiring an official should check with the competing school to verify the official is not on the school's "not preferred list." Officials affiliated with your school may not be used. See officials listing.

**The Athletic Directors shall assign two (2) officials each and two line judges for the NP Quarterfinal Rounds and Public Semifinals. It is recommended that the home team hire two (2) lines' judges for these matches. The Tournament Director shall assign two (2) officials and two (2) certified officials as line judges for the NP Semifinals/Public Sectional Finals, State Finals and T of C matches.**

If a pre-determined site is used other than for the State Final match, each school shall pay one (1) official.

Recommended fee per official: The fee paid by the home school during the regular season.

**Line Judges in NP Semifinals, Public Sectional Finals and Final Rounds will be paid fifty (\$50) each.**

## RULES

The 2011/2012 National Federation Volleyball Rules will govern all tournament matches.

## EQUIPMENT

The higher seeded team will provide a regulation MATCH ball. In the NP Semifinals and Public Sectional Finals match, Wilson Reaction H7500 volleyballs will be provided, either solid white or tri-color balls, red, white and blue.

## MATCHES

**All matches shall start at the earliest, 4:30 P.M. and no later than 7:00 P.M. at the site of the higher seed, up to the Finals, unless there is mutual agreement. 6 minutes, 6 minutes, and 3 minutes will be allowed for warm-ups.**

**All matches in the tournament will be two (2) out of three (3) sets and will be determined by rally scoring (as per Rule 1, Section 2, Note 1).**

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. TEAMS MUST PLAY ON DESIGNATED DATES, UNLESS MUTUALLY AGREED UPON AND TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR NOTIFICATION. In cases of disagreement, the decision of the Tournament Director is final. Failure to complete tournament round by the deadline date will result in disqualification.
2. Any school entering the tournament and then withdrawing will be subject to penalties as enforced by the NJSIAA and barred from participation for one (1) additional year.
3. Any school not willing or not able to comply with the tournament regulations should not enter the tournament.
4. Coaches must report to the Tournament Director for specific instructions, *i.e.* locker rooms, warm-up area, etc.
5. At a pre-determined site, the higher seeded team chooses the team bench and visiting team calls the coin toss.
6. Each school must provide a site supervisor at pre-determined site/NP semifinal/Public Sectional final sites.
7. **THE WINNING SCHOOL MUST NOTIFY THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR IMMEDIATELY AFTER EACH MATCH** and report scores to [www.njschoolsports.com](http://www.njschoolsports.com) to keep media informed and brackets updated.

## DISQUALIFICATION

Participation by an ineligible player in any match during the regular season results in forfeiture of same match. If such forfeit(s) would have caused the school's failure to qualify for the tournament or if an ineligible player participates in a tournament match, said school will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place; schools eliminated prior to the last opponent will not re-enter tournament competition.

## PROTESTS

Protests based upon an official's judgment, or misinterpretation, or misapplication of the playing rules will not be honored as per NJSIAA Bylaws, Art. VII, Section 1.

## ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

Players and coaches involved with alcoholic beverages and/or illegal substances before, during or after the match, at the match site or on school property, including chartered busses, shall be suspended from NJSIAA tournament play for one year and be denied any championship rights.

This action was taken in support of the fact that such actions concerning alcoholic beverages and illegal substances are in violation of New Jersey State statutes and will be strictly enforced.

**ATHLETIC EMERGENCY PROCEDURE**

Each school participating in the tournament will provide for the care and treatment of their athletes within the school's policy as in effect during the regular season. The athletic emergency procedure of the host school will be in effect during the tournament which will include the establishment of a line of communication for emergent situations.

Some sources of assistance that may be utilized when physicians are not available are certified athletic trainers, emergency medical technicians usually on emergency vehicles, ambulance vehicle with trained personnel, rescue vehicle with trained first-aid personnel and, in some areas, National Guard or Army Reserve Medical personnel assigned to ambulance duty. Schools may also have other school personnel qualified in first-aid, who may be available for duty during activities.

- a. Recommended procedures that may be followed in successful emergency care are:
  1. Immediate, on the spot first-aid by and individual with adequate training.
  2. Communication System. An available, non-pay telephone with an outside line to contact a physician or ambulance service. Arrangements should be made in advance to insure availability
  3. Emergency care facility. Arrangements should be made, in advance, with staff personnel of local hospital or clinic to notify, in case of emergency, that emergency service is necessary.
  4. Notification. The facility to which the injured player is being transported should be immediately informed of the injured player's status. Necessary personnel and equipment should be available in the facility or physicians, on call, could be notified of the emergency.
  5. Transportation. Ambulance, emergency vehicle, first-aid vehicle or rescue vehicle, with appropriate equipment and personnel may be parked at the field or game site. If this procedure is not feasible, prior arrangements should be made to have equipment on call when an emergency develops. Again, an available, non-pay telephone with an outside line should be immediately available.
  6. Communities without physicians, medical clinics, or hospital service should complete arrangements with medical personnel and hospital facilities in the nearest community where such services are available.
- b. The plan of action specified above should be carefully covered, in advance, with responsibilities of all concerned – trainer, coach, vehicle personnel, school administrators, local police, deputies, or constables defined. When an emergency does occur, everyone involved can function as an informed, effective team.
- c. Local plans of action to meet emergency situations will vary depending on availability of medical personnel and facilities, the location of the playing field or site and communications. In all cases, the emergency situation plan is best developed through cooperative action of local school personnel, participating professional medical staff and allied groups.

ATTENTION: Principals, Athletic Directors, All Coaches and Officials  
 RE: Recommended Precautions Against The Transmission of Blood-Borne Pathogens  
 All member schools must provide all coaches with the contents of the NJSIAA Infectious Disease Policy.

The Infectious Disease Policy provides that:

If an individual gets someone else's blood on her skin, protective gloves should be worn to wipe the blood off with a disposable towel using soap and water.

Note: If any blood gets on an opponent's uniform during competition or a teammate's uniform during practice, it is not necessary to clean the uniform at that point unless the opponent or teammate has an open cut or unskinned area, or the blood is on a part of the uniform which might come in contact with mucous membranes. If the student-athlete does have an open cut or unskinned area or believes the blood might come in contact with mucous membranes, then the uniform should be wiped with soap and water.

**SALES/SOLICITATIONS**

Only NJSIAA promotional items will be sold at NJSIAA sponsored events. For the 2011/2012 seasons, Team IP is the designated vendor.

Solicitations, sale of publications/products, or similar activities are NOT permitted without prior authorization from NJSIAA. The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association is the sponsoring association for all levels of State Tournament/Championships. The NJSIAA reserves all rights in regard to the management of these Tournaments/Championships and the sale or distribution of any items or any audio-visual reproductions. Any sale or distribution of clothing, souvenirs or any other items is strictly prohibited without permission of the NJSIAA.

TRANSPORTATION/SUPERVISION

1. Schools will pay all transportation expenses for all matches.
2. PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUPERVISING ALL MATCHES. IF IT IS FELT NECESSARY TO PROVIDE POLICE PROTECTION, OFFICERS SHALL BE SECURED FROM THE AREA IN WHICH THE MATCH IS PLAYED, AND THE COST SHALL BE SHARED BY THE SCHOOLS.
3. The NJSIAA will provide security for the State Finals.
4. Each school must provide at least one (1) administrator (or his/her designee) at all NJSIAA designated neutral sites. They should report to site manager.
