

2021-22 NJSIAA GIRLS GOLF TOURNAMENT

The NJSIAA reserves the right to adjust, change or cancel dates, times, and locations for all NJSIAA State tournaments. Schools entering the tournament will not be granted a change of date/time due to any conflicts with school trips, proms, banquets, SAT's, graduation, and the like. In addition, all schools competing in this tournament must adhere to the NJSIAA state tournament COVID-19 policy which can be found on our website under current resources or by following this link: https://www.njsiaa.org/sites/default/files/documents/2021-11/njsiaa-state-tournament-policy.pdf

Member schools not willing or able to comply with all tournament regulations should not enter the tournament. Member schools will not be eligible to participate in any NJSIAA Championship Tournament if it has violated the NJSIAA Constitution, Bylaws, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Policies, and Procedures.

In all tournaments conducted by the NJSIAA, each member school must compete in its own group and section classification, unless fewer than eight (8) schools qualify. In that case, the Executive Committee may combine one or more groups. When the committee eliminates sectional championships because of an insufficient number of schools qualifying, the State Group Championships will be conducted on a statewide quartile basis or State Championships may be conducted without regard to Groups or Division.

Coaches must have a copy of these regulations as well as a copy of rule Modifications (if any) for this tournament available at all contests. Copies of these documents are also available on the NJSIAA website.

All current USGA golf rules along with any NJSIAA golf rule modifications will govern all tournament games.

To Qualify

- 1. Teams must be competing on a varsity interscholastic basis.
- 2. Sixty percent (60%) of games played on or before the cutoff date must be against New Jersey schools.
- 3. Teams must have played a minimum of eight (8) matches played from opening day to the cutoff date.
- 4. Girls Golf will be using the <u>Average Adjusted Score</u> procedure to qualify and seed all teams.
- 5. The NJSIAA Girls Golf Committee will use the team's six (6) best average adjusted team scores prior to the cut-off date to determine which teams advance to the sectionals.
- 6. The twelve (12) teams with the best average adjusted score total in each of the three sections North, Central, and South, will qualify for that Sectional Championship Tournament.
- 7. Individual golfers from schools that did not qualify for the team tournament are still eligible for the individual tournament if they are among the top fifty (50) according to the average adjusted score list.
- 8. Individual golfers that attend a member school that does not sponsor a golf team may enter the individual tournament if turn in at least six (6) verified scores and are among the top fifty (50) according to the average adjusted score list. These individual golfer's six (6) best scores (not an average) must be played on a regulation(9-hole) course, on or before the cutoff date, these scores must be four (4) or less above par. All scorecards must be verified and signed by the course's golf pro and/or the schools Director of Athletics.
- 9. A regulation course is defined as a course that has no more than 3 par 3's per nine holes and is USGA rated.
- 10. Games completed after the cutoff date will not count even if they were started before the cutoff date.
- 11. Any player with two (2) or more disqualifications in the current season, prior to the start of the tournament, will be unable to compete in the state tournament.
- 12. Any varsity team accumulating three (3) or more player or coach disqualifications prior to the start of the tournament will not be permitted to participate in the state tournament. Seeded teams will forfeit their right to compete if a disqualification limit is reached prior to the start of the tournament for the team.

Entry Procedure

- 1. All varsity schedules & rosters must be entered in njschoolsports.com by the start of the season. Rosters must be checked and updated, if necessary, by the start of the tournament. We cannot guarantee any roster changes made after the start of the tournament will make it into the tournament program.
- 2. All varsity scores must be reported to <u>www.njschoolsports.com</u> as soon as possible after each contest. If you encounter problems, please contact <u>hssupport@njadvancemedia.com</u>.
- 3. All coaches must report their team scores to Shawn Bennett at the following site: <u>sirbennett68@gmail.com</u> This site will calculate the team's average adjusted score for each match. These scores will be used to determine the 12 teams that will qualify for each of the sectional meets. All players whose school does not have a girls program must also report their individual scores to this site.
- 4. Coaches are reminded that all team information must be totally up to date and checked for accuracy.

- 5. The team and Individual entry forms must be completed by the school's coach and verified by the school's Director of Athletics on our website by the due dates listed.
- 6. If a team has entered and qualified for the tournament, you do not have to fill out an entry form for the individuals on the team.
- 7. Do not enter if your school is not able or willing to comply with tournament regulations.
- 8. The Executive Committee of the NJSIAA has ruled that member schools failing to comply with all entry requirements may be excluded from the tournament.

- Team Entry: \$150.00, Payable to the NJSIAA (Please note Girls Golf Tournament).
- Individual Entry: \$20.00 per individual, Payable to the NJSIAA (Please note Girls Golf Tournament).

Tournament Seeding

- 1. The NJSIAA Girls Golf Committee will use the team's six (6) best average adjusted team scores prior to the cut-off date to seed all teams.
- 2. The twelve (12) teams in each section will be seeded by their average adjusted score total.
- 3. The individual tournament pairings will be established by their average adjusted score total.

Tournament Advancement

- 1. The top three (3) teams from each section with the lowest total scores will advance to the state group championships.
- 2. The top fifty (50) individuals in the state based on the average adjusted scoring list will automatically qualify for the State Championships.
 - a. CL: An individual that is in the top fifty (50) and on a team that qualified will count as one of the fifty (50) individual spots available.
- 3. If two (2) or more teams are tied for a championship, a sudden death tie-breaker play-off will take place to determine the Champion and/or qualifiers.
 - a. In a play-off, the low four (4) players in the completed round must be used.
 - b. Ties for four (4) on the team shall be decided at the discretion of the coach.
 - c. If a tie is not broken on the first playoff hole, the tied teams remaining will move on to the second playoff hole, and so on until the Team Champion, Runner-up or qualifiers are determined.
- 4. If there is a tie for 1st place between two (2) players for the individual tournament, we will use a suddendeath one-hole play-off to determine the State Champion and 2nd place.
 - a. If the tie is not broken on the first playoff hole, the two (2) players will move on to the second playoff hole, and so on until the tie is broken.
- 5. If there is a tie for 1st place between three (3) or more players for the individual tournament, we will use a sudden-death one-hole play-off to determine the State Champion.
 - a. If the tie is not broken on the first playoff hole, the remaining players will move on to the second playoff hole, and so on until the tie is broken.
 - b. Once the sectional champion is determined, the remaining places will be determined by a "Match of Cards" beginning with hole #1. If still tied then back nine total, then front nine total.
- 6. In the event an individual qualifies as part of a team, and as an individual, the individual playoff will be decided first, and then the team playoffs will start.

Tournament Rules & Information

- 1. A team will consist of five (5) players with its four (4) best scores counting towards the team score.
- 2. Any member of the team may compete on the day of the State Group or T of C (Substitute rule).
- 3. The Tournament will be conducted with eighteen (18) hole play.
- 4. Each team and or individual must be accompanied by his/her school's head golf coach. No individual will be allowed to compete unless his/her golf coach is present for the entire eighteen-hole round of golf.

- 5. All coaches/certified faculty members must be properly certified and appointed by the Board of Education/Heads of Schools. Tournament Directors will disqualify any contestant who is accompanied by someone in a coaching/supervisory capacity who is not appointed by the school district.
- 6. Any member school withdrawing from competition after having officially entered the tournament may be barred from participating in the NJSIAA tournament the next school year unless truly extraordinary circumstances were present.
- 7. Participation by an ineligible player in any game during the regular season results in forfeiture of said game. If such forfeit(s) would have caused the school's failure to qualify for the tournament or if an ineligible player participates in a tournament game, said SCHOOL will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and the next ranked will advance in their place.
- 8. For the sectional championships, the Sectional directors will designate tee-off times and inform qualifiers, accordingly, including the dress code for their course.
- 9. For the state championships, the tournament director will designate tee-off times and inform qualifiers, accordingly, including the dress code for their course.
- 10. For the State Championships, the Tournament Director will designate pairings and tee-off times and distribute same at a coaches' meeting to be held one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) hour before the start of the State Championship.
- 11. A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. If during a stipulated round, a player uses a device designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (e.g., gradient, slope, slope assist, wind speed, temperature, weather, etc.) the player is in breach of U.S.G.A. Rule 14-3 for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used or turned off.
- 12. Distance is public knowledge, and a distance measuring device is not part of a player's equipment, therefore the device may be shared during the match.
- 13. The use of cell phones is strictly prohibited; therefore, they are NOT to be used as a distance-measuring device for this competition.
- 14. Failure to be present at the time the event is called due to transportation problems, misunderstanding of instructions, tournament regulations, other similar excuses, injury or illness will result in disqualification.
- 15. No spectators are allowed on the course at any time during the match. Any spectator found on the course will cause the player and/or team to be disqualified from the tournament.
- 16. The NJSIAA only recognizes nine (9) holes as an interscholastic match. However, if playing in a match that consists of 18 holes, holes 1-9 and holes 10-18 must be entered as two separate scores.
- 17. In a Tri, Quad, or multiple teams meet, only holes one (1) through nine (9) will count (one time on the same day) for individual qualification purposes.
- 18. No caddies or electric carts are to be used by players. supervising coaches will be provided with electric carts at sectionals and state finals when available.
- 19. Locker rooms will not be available; golfers must come dressed to play.
- 20. Coaches must check-in at least one-half (1/2) hour prior to the school's tee-off time.
- 21. Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players in the clubhouse and on the course.
- 22. As guests of the course, it is imperative that all divots be replaced and all footprints in the bunkers be smoothed.
- 23. Student-athletes who presently are caddies are eligible; provided they are not employed or have not previously been employed as assistant pros.
- 24. Coaches are instructed not to bring students to the tournament who are not participating.
- 25. Coaches are not to play and should not bring your clubs. coaches must serve in some capacity as assigned by the tournament director. Coaches are to act as markers, not marshals. Coaches are not to make rulings; all rulings are to be made by the course pro first or contact Steve Skinner, rules interpreter.
- 26. Dress code no jeans, tank tops, or similar wear permitted. girls may wear regular golf attire. this will be noted on the director's pairings for the state groups and state championships. Shorts are permitted based on local course regulations. Collared shirts must be worn.

Tournament Weather Interruption

If an 18-hole shotgun start cannot finish, use the following to settle the tournament Results. This is to be used if everyone in the tournament has completed a minimum of 10 holes and an alternative day to complete the tournament is not available.

- 1. Team Champion A sum of the aggregate total "over par" (note bogey's = +1, birdies = -1, etc.) for the fewest total number of holes completed by all players in the tournament field.
 - a. Total holes used to calculate the "over par" will be the fewest number of holes completed by any player in the tournament field.
- 2. Team Tie Breaker match of Cards. This is the aggregate team total over-par beginning with each team member's starting hole. If tied after starting hole, move to the next hole, and so on until a champion is determined. The team with the lowest total over-par is the winner.
 - b. If still a tie: Beginning with each player's starting hole, sum the over par total adding one hole's aggregate total over par to the next hole's aggregate total until a champion is determined. (i.e., 1st compare starting hole, if tied add players 2nd hole total over-par to first holes over par, continue adding one aggregate over-par hole at a time until a champion is determined)
- 3. Individual Champion Sum of the aggregate total "over par" (note bogey's = +1, birdies = -1, etc.) only for the fewest total number of holes by all Players in the field. (Use on holes both players played).
 - a. Total holes used to calculate the "over par" will be the fewest holes completed by a player in the tournament field. The individual champion will be the individual having the lowest over/under par total.
- 4. Individual Tie Breaker
 - a. Sum the over-par total for the same holes played by all tied players. The Player that has the lowest over-par total for those holes played by both will be declared the champion.
 - b. If still tied beginning with the lowest handicap hole for tied players. Match the over-par score one hole at a time until a winner is determined. The player having the lowest score relative to par is the winner.

<u>Awards</u>

State Sectional Champions:

- Team Trophy and five (5) certificates for the 1st place team in each group in each section.
- Medals to the top five (6) places in each group in each section.
- All ties for 5th place will receive a bronze medal

State Group Championships:

- Team Trophy and five (5) certificates for the 1st place team in each group.
- Medals to the top five (6) places in each group.
- All ties for 5th place will receive a bronze medal

Meet of Champions

- Team Trophy and five (5) certificates for the 1st place team.
- Individual Trophy to the 1st place finisher
- Medals to the remaining seven (7) places in each event.
